Gregory Lynn Branch, age 62, of Saginaw, passed away suddenly on Saturday, February 9, 2019.

A beloved husband, father, son and brother, Greg was born in Saginaw on January 18, 1957, to Robert J. and Lynne Ann (née Foglesong) Branch. He lived within a mile of his birthplace his entire life.

He married Ann Schneider on September 30, 1995. She survives him.

Greg was a devoted and proud father to his three children, Grace, Samuel and Benjamin Branch. He is also survived by his mother, Lynne Ann Branch; siblings, Karen (John) Kujawa and Scott (Julie) Branch; siblings-in-law, Mary Schneider, Thomas (Denise) Schneider and William (Heidi) Schneider. He also leaves behind beloved nieces, nephews, cousins, and countless friends and colleagues.

He was preceded in death by his father, Robert J. Branch; his father-in-law and mother-in-law, Aloysius and Louise Schneider; and a nephew.

For more than 40 years, Greg created and shaped memorable and lasting messages, stories and brand strategies for thousands of businesses, campaigns, municipal entities, and nonprofit organizations throughout the Great Lakes Bay Region and beyond. A gifted communicator, Greg spent more than 20 years with Princing & Ewend, where he and Ann met, before that agency merged with AMPM, Inc. in Midland, where he enjoyed the last eight years.

In his trademark vest and pocket watch, Greg served on the Saginaw City Council from 2005 until 2013. In 2009 Branch's council colleagues elected him to serve as the city's

mayor, a post he held for four years.

Greg also lent his expertise to several civic and professional organizations including the American Advertising Federation (local, district and national levels) and the boards of Child & Family Services of Saginaw County, the Michigan Historic Preservation Network, MBS Airport Authority and Hidden Harvest.

Dear Ann, I'm so sorry for your loss. I don't believe we've met, but Greg & I have known each other for nearly 40 years. We worked together on many marketing projects for the two theatre projects I had here in town: first, the Alpha Theatre Project & Comedy Construction Company then, later, For A Good Time Theatre. Besides his acumen in marketing and public relations (and as an artist), Greg was always a good one for me to bounce ideas off. Our joint love of words kept us laughing together for years -- most recently just a week ago Friday when I shared a laugh with him about a poor font choice of an ad. I was there when he started his own company, loaning him thousands of dollars to get it going. His unexpected passing, I know, has hit many of us very hard. I will miss his humor and sensibilities.

As "a man of words," I want to share something with you that I know Greg would appreciate as well. It's from Kahlil Gibran's "The Prophet." I have found it to offer peace in the depths of grief.

"Your joy is your sorrow unmasked.

And the selfsame well from which your laughter rises was oftentimes filled with your tears.

And how else can it be?

The deeper that sorrow carves into your being, the more joy you can contain. Is not the cup that holds your wine the very cup that was burned in the potter's oven? And is not the lute that soothes your spirit, the very wood that was hollowed with knives?

When you are joyous, look deep into your heart and you shall find it is only that which has given you sorrow that is giving you joy.

When you are sorrowful look again in your heart, and you shall see that in truth you are weeping for that which has been your delight.

Some of you say, "Joy is greater thar sorrow," and others say, "Nay, sorrow is the greater."

But I say unto you, they are inseparable.

Together they come, and when one sits, alone with you at your board, remember that the other is asleep upon your bed.

Verily you are suspended like scales between your sorrow and your joy.

Only when you are empty are you at standstill and balanced.

When the treasure-keeper lifts you to weigh his gold and his silver, needs must your joy or your sorrow rise or fall."

Blessings on you and your family in this difficult time. My thoughts and prayers are with you.
